President's Message

What can IPNA do for you?

We are very lucky to have an impassioned neighborhood association here in Inman Park. Lots of places don't. Rooted in the decades-long fight to prevent massive highways from wrecking our neighborhood's very existence, IPNA still maintains its original spirit of activism. Overall, IPNA basically provides an organized network of people with one common outlook: We live in the very best neighborhood, and we want to keep it that way!

To that end, IPNA is comprised of volunteers who:

- welcome newcomers to Inman Park and inform them about IPNA:
- hold social events like volunteer fairs, the annual July 4th and holiday parties, diners club, and porch parties so Inman Park residents can get to know each other;
- keep neighbors connected through our members directory;
- strive to assure quality of life for residents of all ages though working with production companies filming in the neighborhood; beautifying and maintaining our green spaces and streetscapes; upholding standards of zoning and historic preservation; and improving infrastructure, mobility, and public safety;
- maintain neighborhood archives and work on special projects such as the Inman Park Oral History compilation in order to preserve our neighborhood's story;
- represent IPNA's interests on the boards of other associated organizations such as L5PA, the Trolley Barn, the Hulsey Yard Visioning Committee, and Freedom Park Conservancy, and keep IPNA informed of ongoing events in those organizations;
- give grants to local schools, the L5P mini-precinct, Art on the BeltLine, the Ponce de Leon Library, and the L5P Center for Arts and Community;
- keep members informed through the Advocator, social media, and our web site; and
- budget to make sure all of these needs are funded.

Q: Does all that get kind of expensive?

A: Yes! The 2020 budget runs close to \$600,000.



Q: How do we fund everything IPNA does?


A: First of all, we put on two of the best events in the City, namely the Inman Park Festival and Tour of Homes and the Wine Stroll!


Security Patrol is additionally funded though the dues of its members, who elect to join both IPSP and IPNA. We also have other sources of income, including:

- donations from some of the production companies filming in the neighborhood;
- help from Trees Atlanta to fund planting of trees and shrubs;



- assistance from Emory University to house and maintain our archives;
- a grant from the Atlanta History Center to produce our Oral History;
- funds from individual homeowners for sidewalk replacement, with additional money coming through IPNA's operating budget;
- allocations from the City for infrastructure improvements;
- Advocator ad sales to local merchants to fund our monthly newsletter; and
- grants from the City and other entities to fund studies and implement improvements in our public spaces.

Q: Who does all that work to raise the money and to spend it for the good of the neighborhood? A: Volunteers! None of IPNA's amazing work would ever

happen without a seriously awesome network of dedicated members.

That's why we need your participation! Here are some things you can do:

volunteers play and find one to match your skill set. There's a job for everyone!




Wishing Congressman John Lewis Well


Carolyn Jordan-White and John White

Kevin and Kathy Dowling
















Inman Park Festival Street Closing and Impacts

It is that time of year again! Festival will be here on Friday April 24th, Saturday April 25th, and Sunday April 26th, 2020. In order to have this amazing festival, the best in the Southeast, we have to close some streets. Please pay close attention to the street closing and remove your cars from the streets prior to the closing in order to avoid being towed.

Closed Friday, Saturday, Sunday: The following streets/areas will close on Friday, April 24 at 7:00 a.m. and reopen on Sunday, April 26 at 11:00 p.m. Cars must be off the street in this area by 7:00 a.m. on Friday, April 24 or they will be towed:

- Euclid Avenue from Elizabeth Street going west to Waverly Way (where it crosses Springvale Park)
- Waverly Way at two areas Popular Circle/-Euclid Ave to the bend in the road (the Freedom stage goes here) and then again from Euclid Avenue to Edgewood Avenue
- Delta Place along the East side of Delta

Park to Edgewood Avenue

- Elizabeth Street from to 144/145 Elizabeth Street to 176/177 Elizabeth Street
- Hurt Street From Euclid Avenue to Popular Circle

Closed Saturday and Sunday:

In addition to the above closures, starting Saturday, April 25 at 3:00 a.m. until Sunday, April 26 at 7:00 p.m. the following streets will close:

- Euclid Avenue from Austin to Edgewood
- Edgewood Avenue from Hurt Street to Druid Circle (west side closest to Spruce)
- Elizabeth Street from Euclid to Edgewood
- Hurt Street from Euclid to Edgewood

Important note: The closings above are the main festival footprint. Cars must be off the street in these areas by 3:00 a.m. on Saturday, April 25 or they will be towed. If you need access to your car Saturday, please relocate it outside the closed areas.

Closed with Resident Only Access Saturday

and Sunday:

The following streets are closed with resident only access starting Saturday, April, 25 at 3:00 a.m. to Sunday April 26 at 7:00 p.m. Note: You may be asked to provide ID to enter these streets with a car:

- Alta Avenue
- Haralson Ave
- Haralson Lane
- Degress Avenue
- Battery Place
- Waverly Way from Freedom Park bend to Euclid Avenue and from Edgewood to Dekalb (See No Parking)
- Elizabeth Street from Lake to Waverly Way and Edgewood to Dekalb
- Hurt Street from Waverly to Euclid and -Edgewood to Dekalb
- Druid Circle from Euclid to Dixie
- Spruce Street from Edgewood to Dekalb (see no parking and parade impact)
- Waddell (see no parking and parade impact)

- Krog one way from Lake Avenue toward Edgewood

Golf Carts in the Festival Footprint:

Personal golf carts are not allowed in the Inman Park Festival footprint during Festival hours. Please see map on page 10.

Personal golf carts will be allowed on Friday night for Butterfly Ball and Saturday night after 7 p.m. for Theater Night. The restrictions do not include Friday any time, but it is illegal to drive a golf cart on public streets open to traffic. Festival security will stop any golf cart with an unlicensed driver or anyone driving under the influence.

President Beverly Miller reported that she and Amy Higgins will attend the Inaugural Intown Leadership Council meeting to be held in February.

She urged everyone to sign up for the Trees Atlanta planting in Springvale on Jan. 18. Lastly, we are looking forward to the February 19 Pre-Meeting, where Senator Nan Orrock will join IPNA at 6:30 P.M. for a screening and follow-up discussion of Suppressed: The Fight to Vote plus a live demonstration of Georgia's new voting machines.

VP for Zoning--Jonathan Miller lead the discussion on two applications: 1. Hudson Grille, 351 Moreland Avenue NE - liquor license application for new business. Amy & Jeff Landau will be opening their 8th Hudson Grille (replacing Front Page News and Tijuana Grill)

Q: Where will people park? A: In the same attached parking garage – valet and paid parking available. Q: Hours of new establishment? A: 11:00 am to 2:00 am Monday – Saturday and 11:00 am - midnight on Sunday.

Motion to approve application.

Seconded. Support – 53 Opposed – 0
2. Crave (TLM 2 Enterprises, LLC, dba Skinny's Hot Chicken; Tiffany Mitchell, Owner/Agent; Ed Rucker, attorney) 1126 Euclid Avenue NE

- application for liquor license - change of ownership. This business has been open a few months under a temporary liquor license and is applying for a permanent license.

Ms. Mitchell is a first-time applicant for such a license; this is her first business venture.

Q: Hours of operation? A: 11:00am to 2:00am Mon – Sat, 11:00am - midnight on Sunday.

Q: Is there live entertainment/music in this venue? A: (Mitchell) No, just karaoke. (Rucker) Application should say "Live music."

Q: Why is music coming out of this venue so loud? (Many immediate neighbors have called police and complained in past several months). A: Restaurant is not sound-proofed like other venues meant for live music. Rucker recommends that they move the bass speaker from the back of the restaurant to the front to solve this problem.

Immediate neighbor on Colquitt Thomas Nybo asked membership to vote against this license request, as the music has been loud and disruptive to his family and there was no immediate neighbor meeting to approve the opening of this business. Immediate neighbor and business owner (Community Music Centers of Atlanta) Phil Sims also spoke on behalf of rejecting this application, mentioning the loud music (which disrupts the sleep of his visiting artists in residence, located directly behind this establishment) and the fact that the L5P Business Association never approved the temporary liquor license. He listed other nearby establishments (Aisle 5) that did install sound mitigation and mentioned that similar improvements were promised last February by Crave but never completed. Neighbor Diana Darris expressed support (in theory) of the success

support (in theory) of the success of this venture but asked if there were any plans for "containment for sound?" A: Mitchell called a managers' meeting to discuss and knew there were complaints but "did not recognize the magnitude of the issue."

IPNA Meeting Minutes, continued

Neighbor Beau Weidman Q: Is it possible to approve a temporary license with conditional restrictions? A: If possible, Mitchell says she would comply.

Neighbor (and L5P business owner)
Dr. Richard Shapiro asked about
parking, saying "This is a space for
retail, not a night club." A: (Rucker)
The city zoning department approved
with no parking.

Jonathan Miller (VP for Zoning) asked if the applicant would consider deferring. A: No, go ahead and vote. A request for a motion to support the application elicited no response. A request for a motion to oppose the application resulted in a motion that was seconded and supported 43-0. Several people in attendance chose to abstain from voting.

Jonathan Miller also briefly presented information about a new proposed zoning ordinance (20-O-1003) which was introduced on January 6 2020 by four council persons and a substitute ordinance was prepared by CD/
HS committee of City Council on

Tuesday January 14 2020. It proposes revisions to the current ordinance that governs the NPU system (section 6-3011 et seq. of Part III of the Code of Ordinances). We will be keeping an eye on it as it appears to introduce new requirements that may not be desirable.

VP for Historic Preservation Sara Wittch introduced neighbor Marjorie Speers, who presented plans for 1057 Washita - Type III Addition. House originally had front porch and she is rebuilding it.

Motion to approve application.

Seconded. Support – 43 Opposed – 0

Sara Wittich also addressed a
question regarding Inman Quarter
exterior painting: Inman Park Historic
Regulations allow for any structure in
Inman park, masonry or non-masonry
to be painted with the owners choice
of paint. Inman Quarter will paint
their structure white.

Treasurer Kay Kirsche presented the current financial report, stating that the 12/31 final revenue (Wine Stroll and dues) totaled \$50k. Expenses

(including sidewalk improvements, lighting for Freedom Park and education grants) totaled \$192k.
Rick Bizot added that installation for that lighting project was about to commence, and thanked Scott Evans for his help in this effort.

VP for Planning Rick Bizot lead a brief recap of December's overview of the LAS Hulsey Yard Development Plan https://hulseymasterplan.com/Q (Cabbagetown neighbor?): In Subarea C, land is designated as a "regional destination" with a potential building height of 16 stories. Is this density appropriate?

A (Rick): Would have to defer to the authors of the plan but assume it is appropriate

Motion to vote to approve plan.

Seconded. Support – 37 Opposed – 6

NPU Neil Kinkopf reported that
a formal complaint of the recent

Vegan in the Park Festival has been
drafted and will be circulated soon for
comments.

VP for Communications Melissa Miller thanked Editrix Carla Jeffries for her work on the new (in house) version of the Advocator and gave a brief update on ad sales (\$14k so far, enough to get us through July). Carla asked membership for contributions of old photos around the neighborhood (70s would be ideal), sent to advocator@inmanpark.

Q: Will the new version someday be in color?

A: Too expensive at the moment, but maybe someday. And maybe online. VP for Public Safety Kevin Curry reported that the IPNA thanked the Inman Park Security Patrol officers with gift certificates from Fox Bros BBQ, which were much appreciated. Look for information coming soon about an APD hosted "active shooter" workshop.


