

Tea in the Garden

I grew up playing in a garden shaded and defined by a massive old Chinaberry tree.

With a massive trunk and a rounded, low-hanging canopy, the tree's white-purple blooms scented the air from April through May. The canopy was thick with hundreds and hundreds of green marble-like fruits, first colored light green, then turning dark ivory. In autumn, the leaves fell to expose a profuse display of leathery Chinaberries. It was then that we would notice the tea hedge at the edge of the tree's branches. The tea bushes formed an evergreen thicket 15 feet long and five feet tall. The glossy green shrubs (in the background all



summer) drew our attention in October with small but fragrant white and yellow blooms. Tea (Camellia sinensis) is in the same family as the ornamental camellias so familiar in the South. However, only the leaves of the tea plant (Camellia sinensis) contain sufficient amounts of caffeine and catechins to give the leaves their characteristic flavor.

The climates of China and the Southeastern United States are very similar. It is not at all surprising that trees and shrubs originally from China also do well here. The hot and humid summers and cool to mild winters suit the many Asian ornamentals that are established, iconic parts of the Southern Garden. In addition to the Asian camellias, we have embraced Asian azaleas, hydrangeas, tea olives, and crape myrtles.

Unfortunately, invasive trees from the same Asian humid subtropical zone also thrive here. Eighteen of the twenty nonnative invasive plants considered a serious problem in Georgia are from Asia. These include Chinaberry, Mimosa, Tallow Tree, Princess Tree, and Tree of Heaven.

Tea camellias grow in the same zones as the ornamental Camellia japonica and Camellia sasanqua. If exposed to unusually low temperatures, these evergreen plants might suffer some frost damage but will survive. All camellias grow best in neutral or acid soil that

is humus-rich, moist and well-drained. Tea bushes thrive in both full sun and partial shade, unlike some ornamental camellias. My grandparents' tea hedge, planted north of the house and just west of the big Chinaberry tree, lived for more than seventy years.

Both green tea and black tea are harvested from the same tea plant - although there are countless varieties. The smaller young leaves and leaf buds are used for making green tea. My grandparents harvested the older larger leaves for the tea they brewed. When I visited a tea plantation in Central Java, Indonesia, I saw that they also harvest the older, larger leaves for making black tea.

There are more than 50 commercial tea growers in the US. More than half of these started production in the last ten years. Dunaway Gardens in Newnan, Georgia is growing tea for harvest using plants propagated from tea plants discovered on their historic grounds. Charleston Tea Gardens, near Charleston, South Carolina, is the largest producer of North American tea, with over 100 acres of tea bushes.

The Camellia Forest Nursery in Chapel Hill, North Carolina, sells twenty varieties of tea plants (Camellia sinensis) recommended for our climate here in Atlanta. They sell potted small one-year-old seedlings and larger three-year-old plants.



Inman Park Neighborhood Association (IPNA) membership:

Inman Park Neighborhood Association (IPNA) membership: Available to those who live within or own property within the boundaries of Inman Park. Membership is \$5 with online registration at inmanpark, org. Membership allows you to vote (see bylaws online for details), gives you access to the directory and makes you eligible for special neighborhood events. In addition to being a member of IPNA, you may register for the Inman Park Security Patrol (IPSP) which staffs off-duty Atlanta Police officers to patrol our neighborhood. There are four levels of commitment beginning at \$50 per year. IPNA meetings are held at 7:30 p.m. on the 3rd Wednesday of each month at the Trolley Barn. IPSP membership is based upon a rolling annual membership term. Your renewal date is one year from your membership date and again every year after that.
